1910 Gerald & I did chores fore-  
Dec 8 noon and the snow day at well  
Ernest & I left home at eleven o'clock  
and came to Oak Lake where I  
took the train for east. A pretty  
cold day. Left there all well  
at home.

9 Left Wpg. at 7:00 last night  
could not get into sleepers  
so had to sit in my seat, but there  
was very few on board and  
we each had two seats to our-  
selves had a pretty sore back  
when I awoke this morn. and it  
Kept pretty stiff all day, train  
is right on time and we are  
getting along fine, a nice lot of  
young fellows are going home  
to England for Christmas  
we are having a pleasant time.  
And not nearly as much snow  
here as in Manitoba

1910 Reached Arnprior at 1:38  
Dec 10 today right on time and found  
Mary well, very little snow here  
Stayed with Mary all night, she  
is very comfortable

11 Yesterday was Sunday, Alex  
Michal came & took Jessie Campbell  
Bell & I to church, and then  
I went home with Alex and  
stayed all night, he brought  
me back to Arnprior this morn.  
and on way down we called in  
to see Duncan Campbell &  
Mrs Beetow. I left Arnprior  
at 4:20 came on to Ottawa & found  
James without any trouble.  
After supper he & I went down to  
Almonte House and there found  
G. Gordon & his brother Tom, we  
all went up to Parliament Bldgs.  
& listened to debate until ten  
o'clock

1910 A fine day not cold and  
Dec 13 very little snow. G. Gordon & I  
went up to W. W. Coops office  
this morn. and heard there that  
J. C. Morris was down from  
Wash. so went to Windsor House  
to see him, he went up to Coops

after him & he is to be employed  
as emigration agent in Scotland  
he left at 3.30 this afternoon  
for Quebec en route for  
St John N.B. and sailed  
from there on ~~Thursday~~<sup>Friday</sup> 16<sup>th</sup>.  
James Klock in Ottawa today  
and I tried hard to see him but  
could not make it out, have  
not seen him for a long time now.

sat in house all afternoon, I

tired so sat in house all after-  
noon. Wrote to Maggie & sent them  
a paper, Alexa went down  
street & posted it for me.  
Came here for tea

" 19 A nice soft day and Suze  
flamed some here in Ottawa.  
" 20 I left here for Carp at 11.50  
got to Carp then Sam & I walked  
out to J. Oliver's where I stayed  
all night, Sam was back to  
Carp where he boards

1910 A very cold day about  
as cold as Manitoba. R.  
Kennedy & I drove from Ottawa  
to J. Armstrong's forenoon and  
stayed there until night, when  
we all went up to Fifth Line  
School to a concert there,  
only fine in the school room  
last time I was there mother  
& many were there. I went home  
with W. J. Johnston and  
stayed over night with him  
then went to Ephraim Wilson's  
for dinner, then to Edwards  
for tea and Irvin drove  
me down to Mr. Wilson's for  
night I stayed there until  
after all night. A very  
fine day and not cold

1910 Stayed at Mr. Wilson's  
Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> all night and until after  
noon today when Tom took me

to 3<sup>rd</sup> line grave yard then  
my, and I saw father &  
mother's grave, the first  
time I have been in that  
grave yard since father  
was buried it brought back  
painful memories and I  
would like to go back 30  
years in my life and live

& Tom & I came down to Ottawa  
to have Christmas dinner  
at Jennings

1910 Tom & I had dinner at  
Dec 16 atay with Jimmy & girls  
yesterday Christmas. Today all  
places of business closed up.

town hall in Westboro and

cause all were elected by  
acclimation. A fine day  
not cold a little snow

" 27 A fine day not a bit  
cold. I went to buildings  
to see Jim Eley this morn.

to his mother's today and  
took me up to his place

a tooth filled. Did not  
freeze any all day snowed  
a very little today and  
tonight very soft snow.  
Said in Ottawa paper tonight  
that they are having a great  
lot of snow in Manitoba

1910 I went up to Agincourt this morn.  
Dec 30 and spent the day between  
Uncle's & Mary Bell's. A very stormy  
cold day wind blowing hard  
Fred Klark home from work  
" 31 I got horse & cutter & two traps  
G Klark & I went out to see  
along the roads very badly drifted  
and we had to go through the  
fields. It was 35 below zero  
this morn. & I heard it was  
42 below in Winnipeg. I got  
down to Ottawa at two o'clock  
and had a tooth filled. Alone  
& I went down to Raine's store  
& got some things for the folks  
at home, as I intended leaving for  
Ottawa on Sunday for Toronto. I did  
intend going to see J Harvey on Sunday  
but they will not be at home  
so I will leave for home

1944 Sat Aug 16th - 1944 Sun Aug 17th  
Left Brandon to Bismarck and the Black Hills  
arriving at the latter about 10 AM. Found no trout in the lakes  
but did catch a few small brook trout and some whitefish.  
Dinner at a local place.  
After dinner went to the city and saw the  
newly completed Bismarck Dam. A large  
dry dock was also seen.  
Left Bismarck about 1 PM and took the  
train to Devils Lake. Arrived there about 3 PM.  
Stayed at the Hotel and had dinner there.  
Left Devils Lake about 10 PM and took  
the train to Bismarck.  
Left Bismarck about 11 PM and took  
the train to Minot.  
Arrived in Minot about 1 AM and  
left town about 10 AM and took the  
train to Devils Lake.  
Arrived in Devils Lake about 1 PM and  
had dinner at the Hotel.  
Left Devils Lake about 3 PM and took  
the train to Bismarck.  
Arrived in Bismarck about 5 PM and  
had dinner at the Hotel.  
Left Bismarck about 7 PM and took  
the train to Minot.  
Arrived in Minot about 9 PM and  
had dinner at the Hotel.  
Left Minot about 10 PM and took  
the train to Devils Lake.  
Arrived in Devils Lake about 11 PM and  
had dinner at the Hotel.

1911 Got along fairly well on train  
Sat 6 today but roads seems awful  
rough & I never rode a car that  
seemed to be so rough and very  
one is sick, it is about as bad  
as in a vessel. The Laurier car  
is about as full as it can  
be

7 We kease on board train that  
it was 42 below zero at  
White River station this morning  
train reached Winnipeg at four  
o'clock today, we should have  
been there at 12.40 Weather  
pretty cold. Had tea at Eatons  
then hunted up R. J. Holmes his  
wife used to be Penny twore bird  
I stayed there until 12 o'clock  
at night then went to station  
got into car and did not leave  
for Oak Lake until three

1911 Arrived Oak Lake yesterday  
Sat 9<sup>th</sup> Sunday at nine o'clock, a  
very cold day and it stormed quite  
a lot last night and is very cold  
~~this morning~~ when I got off train. I  
heard that Mr. McShea was at Mr.  
Claire's home one pip with him  
and I came home with Mr. Claire  
Snow deep and roads bad. Cecil and  
Mr. Claire started for Ryerson Church  
but could not get there so turned back.  
Mr. Claire went back to Oak Lake. M.C.  
and Lizzie here afternoon. Today Monday  
is a regular blizzard, we all sat in  
house all day long just did chores a  
very bad day could not get house warm  
A fearful bad time a great lot of  
Snow and drifted deep in places.  
I find the weather here far colder  
than in last. I worked at books  
for Afr. Society all day

1911 A fearful cold day and stormy  
Saw 10 our boys did work so to soon  
it was too cold and stormy. I sat  
in house all day, boys did chores  
and stayed in balance of time  
to Kline went to Oak Lake and  
boat home our mail

" 11 A very cold day 40 below zero  
this morn. and stayed around 30  
all day. Boys went to school today  
for first time since holidays  
Cecil & I went to Oak Lake after  
noon & boat home half a ton of  
hard coal, roads very heavy and  
we had plenty on. Errol tried  
to get load of steam & got stuck  
in snow we took it.

" 12 A cold day 30 below this morn.  
Ralph not at school today he has  
earache. Got load man to stable  
Cecil went for coal & boat home half a  
ton of Galt. Roads very bad

1911 A very cold day 34 below this morn. Did  
Saw 13 chores all day and afternoon Errol went  
to Oak Lake to seed fair. Melville came  
home from Graden today with Errol. a  
little snow falling all day but not  
half an inch fell in all. Very cold  
and disagreeable

" 14 Thirty six below this morn. when  
we got up. Errol and I got two loads  
of straw today one we put into loft  
Cecil went out for Galt coal but  
there was none so he came home  
empty. Melville studied all day.  
Uncle W.C. boys & girls here tonight.  
A clear day and not a breath  
of wind but very frosty

" 16 A cold day and wind blew hard  
from east, Maggie & I intended going  
to Oak Lake to see Sadie off but we  
did not. Cecil brought home two  
loads of coal today

"1911 A cold day but sun shone  
Saw 17<sup>th</sup> bright & clear all day, wind turned  
from east to S.W. and it shifted  
a lot from that direction. Eerral went  
to Oak Lake with Mr Carpenter  
then went from Oak Lake to J.P.  
Smiths with R.R. Eerral int. set  
going out to join Forester's trip  
but it was too stormy. I read a  
book today called "The life of  
J.Y. Sherman" tea up to zero  
today has been around 30 for  
the last week.

"18 A fine day we very cold  
thermometer above zero for awhile  
today. Eerral went to Oak Lake after-  
noon and boat home mail

"19 J.R. Kennedy got home last  
night from east. A regular lizard  
today some times and about an inch of  
snow fell. Eerral helped H.C. build  
sher today. Wind east all day.

"1911 Sun shone clear & bright all day  
few ro but wind was strong from north  
and snow drifted a good deal. Maggie  
& I went up to W.C.s after dinner  
and stayed there until eight o'clock  
then on way home we went to H.R.s,  
and got the mail. Very frosty to-  
night

"20 A fine day. Chored forenoon and after  
Eerral took Sam over to J.Carpenter. Maggie  
& I went to Oak Lake had tea with  
Jill & her Little. There was a meeting of  
Brain Bravers there today. Came on  
a fine sun for awhile ~~this~~ evening  
but did not account to much

"23 Not cold today but very windy  
from N.W. at times and drifted a  
lot but thermometer was above zero all  
day. Eerral & I went to Oak Lake  
after noon & had lecture on Initiative  
& Referendum a good crowd there. We  
got home at dark.

1911 Stommed a regular blizzard  
Snow from north all day sometimes  
could not see Mr. Sommers house  
no snow fell, just drifted what  
was on ground. Our pump  
went wrong and horses got no  
water at all. Wind very cold  
and we will hear of some people  
lost after this.

" 25 A fine day. Thermometer stayed  
around zero all day and hardly  
any wind, what there was blew  
from east. W.R. Smith &  
J.R. Kennedy came up in traps  
and helped us pull pump out  
of well then drove to Oak Lake,  
and got deer saeter but still  
pump would not work and  
we are as bad as ever. I now  
had to dip water with pail  
today

(22)

1911 Thermometer around zero all day  
Snow but it was a bleak day  
as seen around N.E. & trying to snow  
a little all day, tonight as we  
go to bed it is becoming good &  
hard. I want to Oak Lake early &  
got some repairs for pump on way  
home boat. W.R. with me then  
after dinner Reuben came up & we  
all worked at putting in pump,  
but broke a coupling just as we  
got it in, so I had to go out again  
tonight for a coupling. Had to  
dip water again today for all  
stock.

" 28 A fine day from zero to 20 below  
all day, but seen was hot and hardly  
any wind. Reuben came up and helped  
us put in pump, it worked all right  
this time only very heavy. Reuben, W.R.  
& I broke road up to Church today.  
Carol went to Skating rink tonight

1911 28 A fine day very little wind  
Jan 28 and Sun was warm. Cecil  
& grandpa came down at noon  
and after grandpa & I went to  
Oak Lake, I was at an agr.  
society meeting there, we got home  
at dusk, grandpa is staying  
all night so. Very cloudy tonight  
and feels like snow  
" 30 A fine day thermometer kept  
around zero all day. Maggie & I went  
up to J.S. Littles for dinner they  
are few years married today.  
Carol & Cecil went to W. Swings  
& brok down his hull. Grandpa  
has been here a couple of days  
much snow at noon today  
" 31 A fine day clear & frosty. Went  
no wind and pleasant for working.  
Went to Careys in Kuy. & bought four  
cords of elin at \$5.00. Cecil took home  
two loads afternoon

1911 Blew hard from N.W. all day  
Feb 1<sup>st</sup> snowed some and drifts hard  
a very disagreeable cold day, and  
we all sat in house after doing  
chores. Roads will be as bad as ever  
again I guess  
" 2 A fine day only it snowed a good  
lot kept falling a little snow all day  
Carol helped Ruben to fix his well  
today. Cecil went to Oak Lake for-  
noon & got mail. Carol & Cecil went  
to Oak Lake to Kate tonight.  
Very frosty tonight and will be  
good cold before morn. Thermometer  
Kept about ten below all day  
" 3 A cold day with a slight wind from  
N.W. less raw, Cecil hauled two loads  
wood from Careys. Carol & I cleaned out  
carries pen and then began at Bull  
pen and got some of it out, the manure  
is all frozen there. Melville came home to-  
night. We had a simple meeting tonight

1911 A very fine day, sky clear  
Feb 4 and not a cloud but it  
was a keen frost all day and  
a breeze from N.W. forenoon then  
towards night it turned east  
Maggie & I went to Oak Lake  
after noon got back at dark  
Cecil drew two loads wood  
afternoon, Melville studied all  
day, Terrol did chores & got  
load of steam

" Wind east all day yesterday  
and very cold we did not go to  
church. Last night snowing as  
we went to bed. A fine day and  
not cold wind SW. all day  
and began to snow at 4 o'clock  
and still at it as we go to bed  
lots of snow falling. Terrol & Cecil  
gone to carpenters tonight. Grace & I  
went to Oak Lake afternoon. Roads  
very heavy

1911 A fine day until about four  
Feb 7 o'clock when it began to blow  
good hard from N.W. and drifted  
a lot although sun was shining  
brightly. Maggie & I went to J. S. Little  
at eleven & got Mary & Mr Smith  
& we went on to Lomé and had  
dinner there, we got home after  
dark. Roads very bad had to break  
it from Goddards to P. Phillips and  
Coming home, we came Harness road  
& had to break it across G.C.  
field. Cold tonight. Cecil went  
to Oak Lake afternoon in cutter.

1911 A fine day but frosty  
Feb 7 Errol went to W.H. after  
noon and helped him kill  
three pigs, Cecil bought some load  
of wood afternoon from Careys  
& a fine day until about  
four o'clock when it began  
to blow good & hard from N.W.  
and drifted a lot although  
sun was shining all day.  
Maggie & I went to J. S. Littles  
got Mary & her father and went  
on up to J. J. Smiths for dinner  
got home after dark. Roads very  
heavy we had to make track  
from Reubens to Phillips.  
Coming home we came by Harneys  
road to W.C.'s west gate and then  
had to break a road across his  
far quarter it was hard work.  
Cecil went to Oak Lake today.

1911 A fine day frosty but calm  
Feb 9 & pleasant. I went out with 28½  
bushels wheat and got a great deal  
for same brought home three  
barrels of bran two bags of flour  
& some hard coal. Had a winter  
board meeting today. Errol & Cecil  
cleaned at bull pen today, & to-  
night are gone to W. Gauff's.  
"10 A fine day no wind and on  
south side of buildings the snow  
melted some. Cecil got load  
of wood forenoon and after he  
went to Oak Lake and got some  
hard coal. Errol & I cleaned  
at bull pen and got most of  
it out.  
"11 A nice warm day no wind and  
sun was hot. Errol went to Oak  
Lake afternoon. He cleaned some at  
stable today. Cecil took load chop to  
I Baillies

1911 A fine day hardly freezing all Feb 13 day. Cecil took Grace & Eural out to Oak Lake at noon the former was taking a music lesson & Ferrel went to Jeff. I shoveled snow from straw stack it echoed around fe-  
erally.

" 14 Another lovely day no wind and it froze hardly Aug. It kept cloudy all day but we could see sun sometimes through clouds. Cecil & I did chores for-  
noon & got load of straw. Afternoon we broke a road up to far straw pile & these hauled home 31  
bags of flax to run through flaxing mill. Sun about sixteen inches deep on stubble

1911 a fine day. Cecil & I did chores Feb 15 forenoon and afternoon Maggie & I were to Oak Lake, where Maggie attended a Ladies Aid meeting. Cecil went up to Roseth & Mrs. Dixon with flax. A warm day in the shade out of wind and it was dropping from house but out in wind it was cold enough

" 16 A fine day again but a little colder than yesterday. W. Gauff here this morn. and I paid him for Hellies Coal. I took some well lumber on to Griswold this afternoon and on road home brought load wood from Careys. " 17 A fine day and not cold Sun shone hot all day, but wind was cold from N.W. Cecil went to Oak Lake afternoon & bought wellfull home also some coal. We all went to concert in school tonight

1911 A fine day Cecil & I got  
Feb 17 load straw forenoon &  
after he went to Oak Lake  
with a sleigh and

" 18 A fine day again today  
Melville helped me do chores  
forenoon and after he studied.  
Cecil went for load ice after  
noon and did chores.

Cecil & Melville went to Milnes  
tonight. Had phone from Errol  
he is at Johnstons tonight,  
he came up from Wpg today  
" 20 A little colder than we have  
had it lately but still a pleasant  
day. Got load of straw and  
cleaned our calves forenoon,  
then after got little engine over  
to granary. Cecil & I got down  
eleven bags of flax & cleaned  
out one hen pen. Errol got little  
engine running

(32)

1911 a fine day clear cold but  
Feb 21 pleasant and sun shone all  
day. Cecil & I brought down all  
the flax from granary in field  
today Errol ran farmyng mill  
all day & cleaned a hundred  
bushels of flax for Steele,  
Briggs. Co of Wpg.

" 22 A fine day and sun shone  
hot. Cecil went to G. Ro. and  
got a sleigh with box on and  
we got the two loads of flax  
on and bags left for Oak Lake  
right after dinner. Errol upset  
his load three times before he  
got to Harrison, so he took  
Ceils load on to Oak Lake  
and Cecil brought his sleigh  
home and left flax on road.  
Will go out tomorrow & take  
it on

(33)

1911 A nice warm day and snow  
Feb 23 melted a little. Errol & Cecil  
went out with two sleighs and  
got all the flax delivered at Oak  
Lake and shipped. After noon  
we got rack changed from  
wagon to sleigh and got loads  
straw. Errol finished cleaning  
flax. Mr. Penner here and got  
half a bushel of flax. Maggie  
went up to see Mrs. Gump.

" 24 A fine day again. I did chores  
all day. Errol & Cecil left at  
six this morn. and went down to  
G. Oliver's for hay, brought  
home one load. Melville came  
home from Virden today.

" 25 Cleared over seeds from flax and got  
two full bags of good flax. Cecil, Grace  
& I went to Oak Lake afternoon & he brought  
home sleighs that were getting fixed there.  
A fine day and not cold

(34)

1911 A fine day pretty windy and  
Feb 27 cool but not bad. Cecil  
Coral went for hay today got home  
early. Maggie & I went out to Oak  
Lake afternoon and got a few  
loads.

" 28 Fine until noon although it  
was fairly windy but afternoon  
it blew very hard and drifted  
a lot. Errol went after Mr.  
Penner's sleighs with box on  
and I went to Oak Lake & got  
a load of salt coal. We got  
two loads hay into loft and  
also got a load of straw  
hay. A fine day blew a good  
deal all day but not cold and  
where it was sheltered the snow  
thawed a little. Errol & Cecil went  
for hay today and got two good  
loads. I did the chores at home
